#### SPOTLIGHT ON THE COMPOSERS



John Williams was born in New York in 1932. When he was a teenager, his family moved to Los Angeles, and became very interested in music. He studied composition, or the art of writing music, while he attended UCLA and

eventually joined the Air Force. While in the Air Force, Williams wrote, arranged, and performed music with the Air Force Band—he primarily played piano and brass. He then went on to Julliard School and Eastman School of Music in New York, where he studied composition. Williams made his way back west to Los Angeles after he graduated and became one of the most well-known **film composers** today! He has composed and arranged music for movies such as the **Harry Potter** series, Jaws, Superman, and Star Wars!



Georges Bizet was a famous French composer, born on October 25, 1838 in Paris. He was raised in a very musical family; his father was a singer and his mother was a pianist. Bizet started learning music from his mother at an early age,

primarily playing piano, and was accepted to the **Paris Conservatoire** when he was only 9 years old! By the time he was 17, he had written his own symphony! Although he earned a living mainly by arranging and transcribing music, he would also be known for his **orchestral works** and for his **opera**, **Carmen**.



Leonard Bernstein was an American composer born on August 25, 1918 in Lawrence, Massachusetts. Bernstein fell in love with the piano at age 10, when his aunt asked Bernstein's family if she could store her upright piano at their

family home. Bernstein would raise enough money to pay for lessons on his own! After showing love and determination in learning the piano, his father would inevitably buy him a baby **grand piano** when Bernstein turned 13 years old. Bernstein continued to practice and show interest in music, and he eventually attended Harvard University. He would spend some of his young adult life **transcribing music**, but he eventually became the conductor of the New York City Center Orchestra and found a love for **teaching music**. He would **compose** many different pieces of music, such as an **operetta** called *Candide*. However, he is most well known for his **musical**, *West Side Story*!



John Kander is an American musical theater and film composer who was born on March 18, 1927, in Kansas City, Missouri. He grew up loving to sing and play the piano! He started writing his own music in elementary school, which

was even performed during the holidays by his entire school! He would go on to study music at Oberlin Conservatory and Columbia University, writing music for the rest of his life. Kander was also part of a **songwriting duo** with **lyricist**, Fred Ebb. Together, they created sixteen **Broadway shows**, such as **Cabaret** and **Chicago** and worked on such films as **Funny Lady** and **New York**, **New York**. Kander would also go on to win many awards for his music, such as a **Tony**, an **Emmy**, and a **Grammy**!
